

Call for nominations – 2020 CAUL Board Election

In line with section 3.3 of the CAUL Constitution, nominations are called for the election of a director to the [CAUL Board](#).

The regular renewal of the Board's membership ensures:

- Leaders are refreshed to meet the challenges of a changing environment
- The right people, skills and experiences fill vacancies
- Disruption to the governance of CAUL is minimised
- CAUL is able to anticipate and manage future needs

Nominations are called for the position of Director (Elected) that is currently held by Constance Wiebrands (Edith Cowan University) whose term ends on 30 September 2020. Nominations for the position are invited from eligible CAUL members (i.e. members that hold Full Membership defined in clause 2.1.2 of the Constitution) for election as a Director to the CAUL Board for the term of two years.

Nominations will be accepted from **9am AEST on Monday 10 August until 5pm AEST on Monday 24 August**. Nominations should be lodged using the [online nomination form](#).

Some key information on the CAUL Board and this election

What is the CAUL Board? The CAUL Board is accountable for the effective governance of CAUL and establishes strategic priorities aligned to its purpose. The Board exercises due diligence through its commitment to the [Constitution](#) and the [Board Charter](#), working to a Board Calendar and fulfilling audit and risk management obligations.

How many positions are there on the Board? The Board consists of four (4) Directors elected from among the full members of CAUL and three (3) Directors appointed by the Board for their skills and experience (not required to be a member of CAUL). Terms for Directors are two years and elections are held each year as terms end.

What are the roles of Board members? There are three ongoing officer roles to which Directors of the Board can be assigned by the Board: Chair, Deputy Chair and Chair of the Finance, Risk & Audit Committee. A fourth ongoing officer role is that of Chair of the Content Procurement Committee which is equivalent to a program director role. Program director roles are assigned as needed to lead the implementation of strategy. The Executive Director is an ex officio member of the Board. How is the Board supported? The Board is supported by the CAUL National Office, program project groups, issues-based working groups, advisory committees and communities of practice. Board members have access to a comprehensive online Board Manual including Board Induction for new members as well as an online repository of Corporate Documents. Board members are covered by Management Liability Insurance.

What is the Board responsible for?

- Strategy, policy and its execution
- Governance of the association, prioritisation and allocation of resources
- Establishing and fostering strategic partnerships and collaborations to address, nationally and internationally, the issues and opportunities impacting Australian university libraries

How often does the Board meet? The Board meets at least six times per year with two to three in-person meetings, when possible, and the rest via video conference.

How many positions are available in this election? One position – Director (Elected)

How does nomination work? Full Members of CAUL (University Librarian or equivalent at Australian institutions) are:

- eligible to nominate themselves
- eligible to be nominated by another Full Member
- eligible to be nominated by another Full Member who is acting in the role of University Librarian or equivalent during the nominations period
- eligible to be nominated by an Associate Member of CAUL (CONZUL member)

A Full Member who is acting in the role of University Librarian or equivalent during the nominations period is not eligible to nominate themselves or be nominated. In all nominations, the Full Member of CAUL being nominated must give consent to their nomination.

When do nominations open and close? Nominations will be accepted from 9am AEST on Monday 10 August until 5pm AEST on Monday 24 August 2020. The Returning Officer will issue a receipt for all nominations received, via email.

What happens next?

If there is only one valid nomination for the position, the uncontested result will be announced following the close of nominations. Should more than one valid nomination for the position be received, details of nominees will be publicised and an election will be held over two days from Thursday 27 August to Friday 28 August 2020. The poll result will be announced by 9 September 2020 and the successful candidate will assume the directorship on 1 October 2020.
